# Consolidate Lucy Elementary School into Woodstock Middle School and Reconfigure to K-8 Grade Structure

Impact Report
October 21, 2025

Recommendation to be effective for the 2026-27 school year

#### **Recommendation**

The recommendation is to consolidate Lucy Elementary School into Woodstock Middle School, creating a K-8 grade structure.

#### **Rationale for Consolidation**

In 2023, a new state law went into effect that bars county school systems from operating schools within the geographic boundaries of a municipal school district. Lucy Elementary is operated by MSCS but is within the boundary of Millington Municipal Schools. In December 2022, MSCS and Millington came to an agreement that Lucy Elementary would be deeded to the municipal school district on or before June 30, 2027.

The proposal to transfer the school to Millington early, will keep the district from investing any more money in a building that it will not continue to own. The facility condition assessment identified \$2.5 million of needs over the next two years. The students from Lucy will be assigned to Woodstock, which is only one mile further away from most of the students in the attendance zone. Combining the students and resources of these schools will create more opportunities for all students.

#### Consolidated School Academic and Extracurricular Offerings

The facilities team is in the process of assessing the needs Woodstock Middle School and will have the proposed list of investments compiled for the community and school meetings. Currently, new bleachers are being installed, and the gym is being painted at Woodstock.

Tennessee's school letter grading system provides a snapshot of how each school performed based on student achievement, growth, and college & career readiness. In 23-24, Lucy Elementary earned a "D" and Woodstock Middle earned a "C". The School Performance Scorecard (SPS) uses the following performance categories and levels: *Needs Improvement* (1 - 1.99), *Fair* (2 - 2.99), *Good* (3 - 3.99), and *Excellent* (4 - 5). In 24-25, Woodstock's performance on the SPS placed them in the *Good* category; however, Lucy's performance was scored as *Fair*.

Students who score "Met" or "Exceeded" on TCAP assessments are considered proficient. In 24–25, Lucy's ELA proficiency rate was 14.3 percentage points higher than Woodstock's rate of 8%. However, in math, Woodstock's proficiency rate was higher at 20.6%, compared to Lucy's 12.9%. The Tennessee Value-Added Assessment System (TVAAS) measures student growth from one school year to the next. Level 5 is the highest score possible, and Level 1 is the lowest score possible. Level 3 represents average growth. In 24-25, Woodstock earned the highest growth level for Overall Composite and Lucy earned a Level 3.

Chronic absenteeism is defined as a student who is absent for 10 percent or more of the instructional days for which he or she is enrolled in a school (must be enrolled for at least 50% of

the instructional days). In 23-24, Lucy's chronic absenteeism rate (23.1%) was 18.3 points higher than Woodstock's 16.5%.

Lucy Elementary School has had overall declining enrollment from 21-22 to 25-26. The average enrollment at Lucy across the past five years has been 280 students. Woodstock Middle School has had mostly declining enrollment from year to year since 21-22; the exception was one year of an increase in 24-25. The current enrollment, though, is 26 students lower than that year. The average enrollment at Woodstock across the past five years is 240 students.

#### **Facilities Profile**

The original portion of Lucy Elementary is over 100 years old. Woodstock was built in 1956 making it 69 years old. The facility condition indexes (FCI), ten-year maintenance needs, and low utilization of both buildings are similar.


